MANY INSPIRING SPEAKERS TO CHOOSE FROM INCLUDING:

HILDE MANDEL

From a town in Poland with 3000 Jews, Hilde and four other youngsters were the only survivors. She survived by pretending to be a Polish Christian, with a baptismal certificate with her fake name of Barbara Czapccynsk. She worked in an arms factory while living in the barracks and the ghetto. She made her escape and subsequently worked among the Germans, hiding her true identity until the Nazis were defeated.

PAUL MOLNAR

Paul grew up in Hungary. He is a ghetto survivor and a survivor of Auschwitz and Buchenwald Concentration Camps.

FRED RAYMES

Fred was born in Germany and experienced Kristallnacht after which he went into hiding. He survived the Gurs, France Concentration Camp.

MARK SOLENT

Mark's entire family was executed on Nov. 8, 1941 in Dslatyn, Poland along with other Jewish families. As a 16-year old young man, he escaped and survived as a Christian. He joined the resistance and was liberated in the forest by the Russian army.

HENRY TENENBAUM

Henry, a *Generation After* member, tells the story of his parents who grew up in Poland and their survival by hiding and his father's conscription into the Russian army.
